COVID-19 Vaccines and Face Covering Requirements Denver Performing Arts Complex Resident Companies August 25, 2021

To protect audiences and the community from illness and to slow transmission of COVID-19, the resident companies of the Denver Performing Arts Complex: Colorado Ballet, Colorado Symphony, Denver Center for the Performing Arts, and Opera Colorado will require that all patrons who attend public performances in Boettcher Concert Hall, Buell Theatre, Ellie Caulkins Opera House, Garner Galleria Theatre, Jones Theatre, Kilstrom Theatre, Singleton Theatre, and Wolf Theatre be fully vaccinated against COVID-19 with an FDA or WHO-approved vaccine. “Fully vaccinated” means two weeks after a person’s second dose in a two-dose series and two weeks after a single-dose vaccine. Children under the age of 12—who are ineligible to receive the vaccine—must instead provide proof of a negative COVID-19 PCR test taken within 72 hours of the performance start time, or a negative COVID-19 antigen test taken within six hours of the performance start time. No additional exceptions will be made.

For all individuals ages two and older, face coverings will be required indoors regardless of vaccination status except when actively eating or drinking in lobby spaces. No food or beverages will be permitted inside the performance seating area and face coverings are required in those spaces at all times.

This policy goes into effect October 1 and is in place until further notice.

Patrons who are unable to adhere to these policies should contact the organization to which they hold tickets to discuss their options.

Additional details on the vaccine verification and entry process are under development and will be communicated to ticket holders by each resident company in advance of their performance date.
